My wife Cindy and I moved to Sailboat Bay in 2017. We currently have made our home in Unit 1225G.

I attended the University of Alabama (BS) and Texas A&M (ME) with degrees in Engineering.

Upon graduation, I was employed as a civilian with the Army as a Systems Engineer and Program Manager. Most of my duties involved developing, operating, and maintaining manned Intelligence systems. These were aircraft outfitted with a variety of sensors including full motion video (visible and infrared), moving target and imaging radars, radio intercept and direction finding, multispectral devices, etc. These aircraft also had a multitude of data links able to send encrypted voice, data, and video to the ground via tactical radios or satellite links. The systems were deployed to South America, Europe (Bosnia), Iraq, Afghanistan, and Korea. Most are currently still in service.

As a potential SBB Board Member my intent would be to:

- Establish routine business procedures. Provide regular meetings, and follow up with published minutes and financial status reports. Make sure the Board is in compliance with Roberts Rules of Order.
- Make sure all financial decisions consider the effect on property values. Balance any hurricane assessments against HOA fee increases to make sure property values are not adversely impacted.
- Commit to a face to face regular meeting. The meetings will comply to COVID protocols for minimum exposure, but will be open to all homeowners who wish to attend.
- 4) Provide all homeowners access to all Board contracts, financials, etc. upon request.
- 5) Provide personal access via phone or in person in a reasonable manner.
- 6) Expand and empower the existing committees and form new ad hoc committees as needed; relying on these committees to assist in the overall direction of Sailboat Bay decision making processes.

My desire is to establish a community structure which allows all owners to participate, as we all have a vested interest in this community.

I understand budget, price, scope of work and time of execution, all of which need to be taken into account when building or rebuilding.

June and I moved permanently to Sailboat Bay in June of 2011. This is our home, and we intend to stay here. We love the community of this complex and all its features. I am a retired home builder from Memphis, TN and just let my retired contractor's license lapse in 2020. I am current on my technical section for an Alabama Contractors license. My wife Janet and I purchased our unit in 2000. I am an avid fisherman and boater, which was a primary attraction of Sailboat Bay. Our family fell in love with this place, to the point where our son and daughter-in-law purchased here, and are raising their family in this slice of Paradise. Since retiring from the Oak Ridge National Laboratory in 2012 after 33 years in research, environmental regulation, and large facility operations, I formed Fat Boy Consulting, Inc., working part-time around the world on the safe and efficient construction and operation of large scientific facilities. Since 1990, my primary emphasis has been the planning, design, construction, maintenance, and capital improvements of both large and small facilities as well as permitting and regulatory compliance with state and federal requirements. I am currently an advisor or consultant to Projects in excess of \$3 Billion dollars of construction or modification to facilities across the US and in Europe, providing me access to first-hand knowledge of best practices for managing, estimating and reporting costs and progress of construction. My Purdue University BS and MS degrees from long ago are in Meteorology, and my study and thesis were associated with Tropical Storms in the Gulf of Mexico. Because of my specific interest in potential impacts on Sailboat Bay, I have maintained my contacts with the National Hurricane Center, and have provided forecasts to the Board and to other owners.

I had the opportunity to serve on the Board when elected in 2015 (served as second Vice President), reelected in 2016 (served as first Vice President), and reelected once more in 2017, serving as President. Service on the Board proved to be a tremendous learning opportunity about Sailboat Bay. With the damage received during Hurricane Sally, our community faces a myriad of additional challenges, all competing for scarce resources. The 2020 Board faced tremendous, uncommon challenges from Sally and in my view, the focus of our 2021 Board must be to effectively and efficiently continue to rebuild from Sally, which will require open communication, using a variety of methods, to keep owners aware of our situation, our plans for the future, and the alternatives to our plans. I am aware that all owners want answers to their questions as to what is happening to this place we love, and which also represents a very large investment to most of us, and the 2021 Board must be committed to providing these answers. Moreover, I believe it is crucial to use the broad and deep talents and expertise within our community as we move forward. Regular projections of timelines based on progress and updates of our financial situation, including analyses of our potential exposure to costs, will be critical to these efforts.

My goal in running for the Board is the same as in the past - to help keep Sailboat Bay a fabulous place to live and visit while operating efficiently, with an eye towards long-term sustainability and prudent use of resources.

Charlie Ruehl Candidate 2021 Board of Directors

Here are some of the accomplishments of the boards I served on during my tenure on the SBB BOD

- Built an in-house maintenance crew that was the envy of other Associations
- Replaced 250 feet of seawall, boardwalks and finger piers with marine grade lumber
- An additional 250 feet of boardwalk installed by the maintenance crew and funded by the maintenance budget
- Installed dog waste stations
- · Totally rebuilt the hot tub
- An additional 250 feet of boardwalk installed by the maintenance crew and funded by the maintenance budget
- · Remodeled the clubhouse
- Restored heat to the clubhouse pool
- Installed the wheelchair lift giving clubhouse access to all of our owners
- Installed rip rap preventing seawall washout at the bay pool all done in house at a savings of about \$30,000
- Dredged the entire marina
- Replaced problematic PVC piping in the marina with PEX piping to eliminate breakage in cold weather, all with in house labor
- Installed Purple Martin houses to help control the mosquitoes
- Installed concrete tables and benches at both pool site. The cost of each complete set was equal
 to re-webbing three pool chairs.
- Stopped water intrusion with temporary flashing on all affected 4 plex decks
- Demoed, leveled and rebuilt the structure, added structural support and retiled almost all of the upper 4 plex decks as quickly as contractor work flow would allow. The last of which were scheduled to be completed this year.
- Worked for two years with various real estate attorneys to clarify how our condo documents regulate rentals.

As the treasurer during that period I am proud to say all of this and more was done over a 3-year period with a modest Five dollar per month increase in HOA fees in the third year while maintaining both the insurance and operating reserve funds. This was accomplished by careful and thoughtful spending practices and shopping for the best value. Every year at the annual meeting Grant Sanders and Taylor who audit both Sailboat Bay and our accountants, Crowe Shields and Bailey stated that we had one of the financially strongest associations in the area. During this time, I had the pleasure of working with many talented people who all contributed to the excellent results. Many of them are also candidates this year and I encourage you to vote for them also.

We are facing a big challenge in 2021. Our insurance reserves will be diminished by our \$ 660,000 insurance deductible, our maintenance reserves will suffer the same fate covering the inevitable expenses that our insurance will not. Moving forward without restoring these reserves is irresponsible. I am running this year with goal of resuming the role of treasurer and using the knowledge and experience of my previous terms to minimize the financial pain to our owners while giving due concern to our property values and long-term fiscal health.

There is one issue I have a personal need to address and all of the owners have a right to know. I reluctantly resigned my position as president in May of this year. This was due to irreconcilable differences in the path the board should take and a toxic environment internal to the board that made doing the job I was elected to do impossible. I was given no choice other than to go along or resign.

Thank you for your consideration. We have an opportunity to elect a board with over a decade of experience to lead us through these difficult times.
